Summer Camps

Once again, McMaster's popular summer camp programs begin on Monday July 4. Each year several thousand children from across Hamilton attend sports, educational and recreation camps on campus.

Over the past few weeks, we've shared with you McMaster's traffic management plan in preparation for the summer camps. A few reminders:

- A Hamilton Police Services officer will be stationed each morning at the Sterling entrance to ensure efficient traffic flow
- Parents will be directed to the appropriate drop-off and pick-up locations on campus
- Camp buses will use the Main Street entrance to drop off and pick up children
- Parents have been directed to enter campus at Sterling Street and not to park or stop on Mayfair or Forsyth.

Summer camps operate in two-week cycles. Experience has shown that it may take a few days at the beginning of each cycle for parents to familiarize themselves with the parking and traffic routing. As always, your patience is greatly appreciated as we work to ensure a successful and safe camp season for all involved.

Construction Update

Construction continues on the Centre for Spinal Cord Injury Research and Rehabilitation and the Centre for Cancer Education. The new Centres are being constructed as additions to the Ivor Wynne Centre.

The original plan for the building included relocating some trees on the site and removing others. During the construction, it was determined it was necessary to remove a few more trees. McMaster's policy is to plant two trees for every one removed. The University is also considering a plan to plant additional trees around the perimeter of the oval on Mayfair Crescent. In coming weeks, we'll provide greater detail of this plan and we'd welcome your comments.
