Tree-planting update

With construction of the Centre for Spinal Cord Injury Research and Rehabilitation and the Centre for Cancer Education continuing, the University is moving ahead with its plans to plant and re-plant trees in and around the construction zone.

As part of its policy to plant two trees for every one removed for construction, McMaster will plant some native-species trees around the perimeter of the oval on Mayfair Crescent. Trees will be planted in places where there are currently gaps. Ample space will be left in between the new trees and the aim is to create a green buffer between homes and the side of the Ivor Wynne Centre.

Once the construction is complete, more trees will be planted in and around the new building. Planting on the oval will begin by the end of this week.
